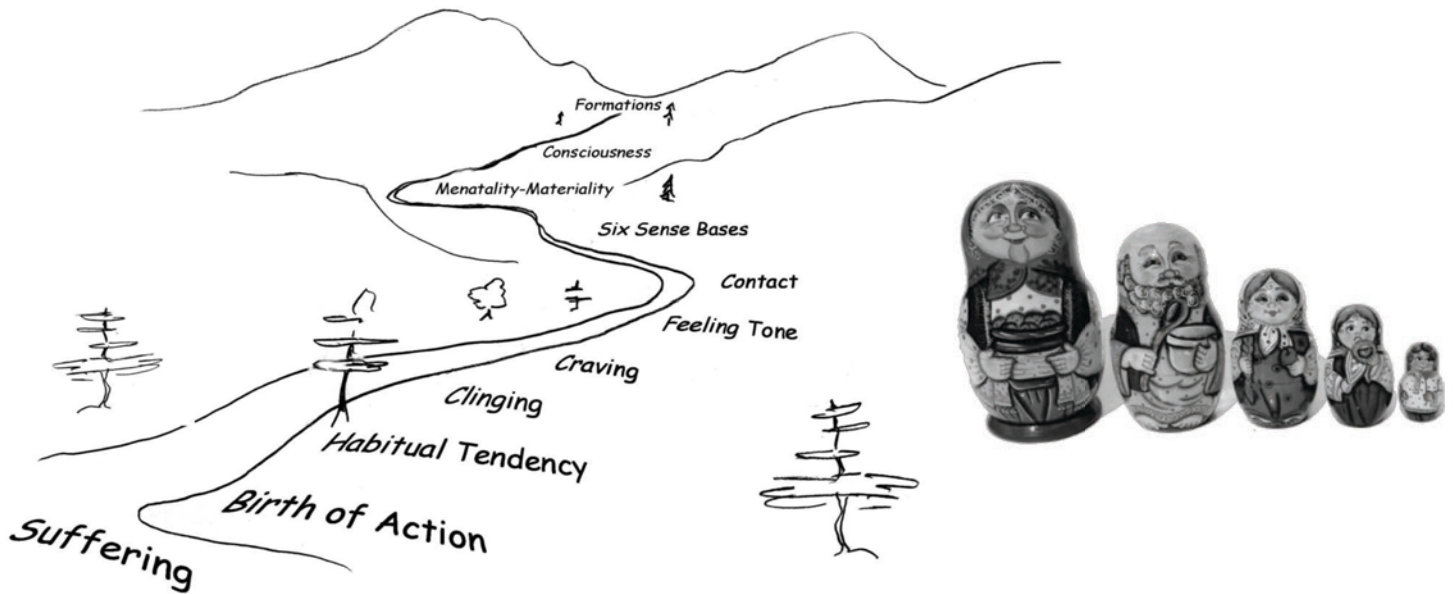


Paticcasamuppāda: Dependent Origination
